Musical maven Guy
Manning has
bemoaned to this very
magazine the dearth of
prog-friendly venues able
to accommodate the fully
tooled, nine-member
complement of his
eponymous 'Electrik' band.
Thus, pared-down acoustic

nights have become a practical way of getting his music out there. Over his decade-long solo career he's built up a catalogue of strongly melodic, folk-inflected music, so this all-acoustic revue of some of his finer moments isn't a drastic departure (it's when Manning keeps things tight like this that he sounds the most convincing).



The spartan, live arrangements here - featuring his band members on woodwinds, keyboards and acoustic guitars - show the strength of the songwriting beneath, from the beautiful Castaways from his debut Tall Stories For Small

Children, The Night And The Devil from Cascade and the refreshingly personal A Place To Hide. Such songs simply shine in this setting. Until the follow-up to his excellent Margaret's Children appears next year, Akoustik will do as more than a worthy stop-gap, though that term doesn't quite do justice to this often gorgeous work. **GRM**
