The Third album from Damanek for GEP sees the band listed as a three piece and this may have changed the overall feel and dynamic of the music, certainly not detrimentally.

This talented trio, namely, Guy Manning, Lead & Backing Vocals, Keyboards, Acoustic Guitar & Instruments, Loops, Samples, Percussion. Sean Timms - Keyboards, Backing Vocals, Programming and Marek Arnold - Saxes, SeaBoard, Additional Keyboards, blend a variety of styles into a mesmerising, thoroughly enjoyable slice of, now the 'problems' begin for this reviewer, in the best possible way.

It is progressive, it is rock, but there is so much more in there, take opening epic Mountain of Sky, maybe the best slice of prog rock I've heard in 2022, with some wonderful changes of mood and superb use of the talents of all concerned. I don't want to give too much, if anything away, it is up to the listener to explore the magical musical tapestry, brilliantly woven into a spectacular living masterpiece.
