PROGRESSION MAGAZINE – AUGUST 2017 REVIEW OF ON TRACK by DAMANEK

Fraternity/Southern Empire family of progressive acts manifests on this album both musically and through a lineup joining players from those incarnations with an array of guest contributors – 18 musicians total. Leading the way on this debut effort are multi-instrumentalist/singer Guy Manning, keyboardist Sean Timms, woodwinds player Marek Arnold and bassist Dan Mash, comprising Damanek proper.

With music/lyrics written by Manning channeled through Timms' masterful production sense, the band breathes unhurried spaciousness into On Track with gorgeous melodic themes and swirling instrumental crosscurrents folding ethnic and jazz motifs into predominant symphonic rock arrangements. Lyrical themes include notably evocative reflections on global human conflict/political and religious hubris ("Oil Over Arabia," "Big Parade"), ecological concerns ("Long Time, Shadow Falls," "The Cosmic Score," "Believer-Redeemer") and indigenous spirituality ("Nanabohzo and the Rainbow").

On ornately crafted 13-minute closing piece "Dark Sun," Damanek addresses the ominous climate-change crisis with heartfelt conviction while demonstrating that somber topicalities need not be imparted with downbeat music. Rather, the sensitively forthright tone of Manning's delivery is poignantly enhanced by a wistful melody that weaves through changeups incorporating tastefully executed rock and jazz passages.
